THE SCHOOL

The Hockaday School is an independent, college-preparatory day and boarding school for girls from Prekindergarten through Grade 12. The school, formed in 1913, is accredited by the Independent Schools Association of the Southwest.

FACULTY

The faculty consists of 120 full-time teachers and 7 part-time teachers, of whom 69 have a Master's degree, and 13 hold Doctoral degrees. The average tenure of our faculty is 11 years.

SUMMER PROGRAMS

Hockaday's premiere Summer Programs provide numerous camp and class opportunities for boys and girls, ages three through Grade 12. Students and campers participate in academic enrichment, ESOL, adventure fitness, performing and fine arts, sports, STEM, and much more. Summer boarding is available. Registration for Summer Programs opens in early February and is available through the Hockaday website.

 labs for independent study. The Centennial Center also

- houses a planetarium, 3-D printers, Foucault pendulum, and sundolier. State of the art equipment will allow students from all divisions to problem solve and prototype.
- 54,000 square-foot Academic Research Center that houses two libraries, a technology center, computer labs, debate and journalism suites, a film studies lab, photography labs, broadcast studio, workrooms, the school bookstore, alumnae archives, and meeting rooms
- Wellness Center that houses an aerobics room, fitness testing area, trainer's facility, and the Hill Fitness Center, an 11,000 square-foot state-of-the-art facility offering aerobic, resistance, and circuit training equipment
- The Nasher-Haemisegger Family Arts Center will open for the school year 2016-2017 with a state of the art 650 seat theater with set shop and full fly space, an art gallery, a choir hall, an orchestra room, a black box theater, ten private lesson studios, a painting and printmaking studio, ceramics facilities with outdoor work and kiln areas, and Middle School music and drama rooms.
- Two newly renovated dormitories boast large bedrooms, WiFi, plasma televisions, full kitchens, and faculty apartments.

ATHLETICS

Facilities include a modern complex with spectator seating for 1,000, three full-size basketball courts, two pools, ten tennis courts, an all-weather track, two racquetball courts, and multiple playing fields. Additionally, the Wellness Center includes state-of-the-art facilities for training and treatment of sports-related injuries. Interscholastic sports include cross country, fencing, field hockey, volleyball, soccer, softball, crew, basketball, swimming, golf, track, lacrosse, and tennis.

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THE ACADEMIC COMMUNITY OF THE UPPER SCHOOL

All courses at The Hockaday School are taught at the highest possible level of rigor. Many courses that do not carry an Honors or AP designation are considered among our most demanding. The required course load is four full-credit academic courses per year, and the maximum course load is five full-credit academic courses. It is not recommended that students pursue more than three advanced courses per year; a maximum of four advanced courses per year may be allowed by special petition. Most advanced courses become available to students in the junior year.

ACADEMIC SCHEDULE

The academic calendar is divided into semesters. Classes are 80 minutes and meet three times in a six-day rotation, 36 weeks per school year.

RANKING AND GPA

It is school policy not to rank Hockaday students. GPA is cumulative, unweighted, calculated on a four-point scale, and includes all Hockaday classes. Honors and Advanced Placement courses are not weighted.

COURSES AND PROGRAMS TO NOTE

Biology (Honors): Biology is not taught as a year-long course at Hockaday. Rather, in a model most usually seen at the college level, students may select from topical semester courses which are each designed to incorporate a common set of basic biology fundamentals. All courses are taught at the honors level.

Business French: This course requires a mastery of French strong enough to succeed in the professional world of business, economics, and finance. The course culminates in the administration of the *Diplôme de Français Professionnel* and prepares students for study and work abroad.

English IV – Senior Seminars: Senior English classes are offered as semester-long courses focusing on a variety of themes. Because Hockaday students are independent learners, many will elect seminar courses that allow them to explore their individual interests over AP English.

History of Art and Music: This required interdisciplinary course seeks to enrich a student's historical understanding by providing instruction in the aesthetic and cultural parallels to the chronological periods that she has already studied in World History.

Integrated Math: Integrated Math I, II and III blend concepts from Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II. Integrated Math promotes problem solving and critical thinking by presenting concepts in a context that requires students to make connections, as opposed to studying math topics one concept at a time. Additionally, logical reasoning, probability, statistics, and discrete mathematics are interwoven into the curriculum.

Latin American Perspectives: Offered only to students who have completed Spanish IV or AP Spanish. This course emphasizes the development of speaking, writing, listening and reading skills, a deeper appreciation of Latin American culture, and the ability to function in the Spanish-speaking world.

AP Studio Art: Due to the great rigor and time requirements of this course, Hockaday counts AP Studio Art as one of the five possible academic solids a student may take in one year. In most instances, students electing AP Studio Art must eliminate a class in another subject area from their schedules.

ADDITIONAL EDUCATION OPTIONS

There are additional education options available to Hockaday students, including The Online School for Girls, directed independent study projects, Hockaday Summer Session classes, CITYterm at The Master's School, Rocky Mountain Institute in Colorado, and Swiss Semester in Zermatt.



FINANCIAL AID

A Hockaday education is an investment in your daughter's future. We recognize that this is a significant financial undertaking and we are committed to making this excellent education affordable for every student, regardless of family financial circumstances.

Who is eligible?

Hockaday seeks to provide financial assistance to qualified students who might not otherwise be able to attend. All financial aid at Hockaday is granted on the basis of demonstrated family need and the school's availability of funds.

How do I apply?

APPLICATION FORM (FORM 1)

Complete the application form and submit it to the Office of Admission with the application fee by **January 15, 2016.**

APPLICATION FEE (NONREFUNDABLE) \$175 for Day and Boarding applicants, Grades 5-12.

The application is not considered complete without the application fee. Please make checks payable to The Hockaday School. If applying for financial aid, contact Cyndi Lewis, Associate Director of Admission and Financial Aid, at 214.360.6521, regarding a reduced fee.

Admission Testing

Grades 5–12 – Hockaday uses the Independent School Entrance Examination (ISEE). Please register directly with ISEE and include the test fee of \$100 with your registration. The Secondary School Admission Test (SSAT) is also accepted.

International Students – ESOL (Grades 8 – 11 only) – For all applicants for whom English is their second language, the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is required in addition to the ISEE or the SSAT. For Grade 8 (Boarding) only, the TOEFL Junior can be substituted for the TOEFL.

PARENT QUESTIONNAIRE (FORM 2)

Complete the questionnaire carefully and return it to the Office of Admission.

STUDENT QUESTIONNAIRE (FORM 3)

The student applicant should complete the questionnaire, preferably in her own handwriting, and return it to the Office of Admission.

TRANSCRIPT RELEASE (FORM 4)

Parents give the Transcript Release Form to an official at the applicant's current school. The registrar then submits the student's transcript to Hockaday.

TEACHER EVALUATIONS (FORMS 5, 6)

If using Forms 5 and 6, please sign and give to the applicant's current English and Math teachers and ask that they be completed and returned to the Hockaday Office of Admission. Forms delivered or sent by parents cannot be accepted. If applying online, please provide your daughter's current English and Math teachers' names and email addresses on the Teacher Information Form. Hockaday will use this information to send online confidential Teacher Evaluations to your daughter's current teachers. The Teacher Information Form is

submitted with your online application.

HEAD OF SCHOOL EVALUATION (FORM 7)

Grades 5–12 – After signing the parental acknowledgment at the top of the form, provide the applicant's current principal or head of school with the evaluation form and ask that it be completed and returned directly to the Office of Admission. If applying online, please provide the Head of School's name and email address on the Teacher Information Form. Hockaday will use this information to send an online confidential evaluation to your daughter's Head of School.

ADMISSION INTERVIEW

Day Applicants (Grades 5-11) - Contact the Office of Admission to arrange an applicant interview.

Boarding Applicants (Grades 8-12 only) - Contact the Office of Admission to arrange both a parent and

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applicant interview.

Grades 5–12 – Submit one small photo (optional).

APPLICATION DEADLINES AND NOTIFICATION DATES

In order to be considered for an admission decision, the initial application and fee must be received in the Office of Admission by January 15, 2016. All additional application materials must be received in the Office of Admission by January 29, 2016. Testing and interviews should also be completed or scheduled by January 29, 2016. On March 18, 2016, applicants who meet the above deadlines will be sent notification of the admission decision. All applications received after the January 16, 2015 deadline will be reviewed on a rolling admission basis.
